






Resident Population Distribution (By Country of Birth)






Resident Population Distribution (By Country of Birth) in 2021





Simpson Diversity Index


Shannon's Diversity Index Vs Simpson's Diversity Index

- Shannon's Diversity Index:
 - cares more about species richness
 - The higher the value of H, the higher the diversity of species in a particular community. The lower the value of H, the lower the diversity


- Simpson's Diversity Index:
 - cares more about relative abundances, the
 - Index range from 0 to 1
 - 0 means no diversity and 1 means infinite diversity




Simpson Diversity Index




Simpson's Diversity Index (2021)




Average Housing Prices in WA




Resident Population who were born in India




Resident Population who were born in South Africa



Resident Population who were born in Malaysia




Resident Population who were born in Ireland




Public Service Provisions in WA




Schools in WA




Western **Australia** Certificate of **Education** completion percentage in WA




Top 100 schools (Median ATAR) in WA




Public Transport Service Provisions in WA

Dimensions of Multiculturalism

Culture

- The shared set of beliefs, values and patterns of behaviour common to a group of people
- Cultural Shock
 - Confusion and discomfort a person experiences in an unfamiliar culture
- Cultural Intelligence
 - The ability to adapt and adjust to new cultures
- Ethnocentrism
 - Tendency to consider one's own culture as superior to others

Challenges Multiculturalism

- Culture Ignorance
 - Intensity personal conflicts and can result in more difficult to deal with
- Lack of implementation or skill or expertise on cultural awareness
 - Even though it has been increasingly promoted
- Cultural Negligence
 - Can impose the adverse impact on community
- Cultural Mismanagement
 - Can cause disagreements or conflicts between foreign partners or among project team members from multiple cultural background
