



- Working in collaboration with NGO partners such as the Vasco da Gama Movement (VdGM)
 https://vdgm.woncaeurope.org/ we have developed and deployed a virtual clinic of more than 60 certified Ukrainian medical professionals.
- We have also built a team of amazing of UCTS volunteers to help with language translation, service promotion & support.
- The service has helped 6,500+ Ukrainian families since the service went live on April 1st 2022, providing medical advice, comfort & care

Statement: After the start of the full-scale invasion of the Russian Federation into Ukraine in February 2022, many patients, including those who underwent surgery, were forced to leave their homes and move abroad or to other regions of the country. The platform GPNow provided an opportunity to contact them, monitor the treatment process, as well as advise new patients who have difficulty accessing medical care due to the language barrier, due to the overload of the medical systems of the host countries, give comments on the results of examinations, give a second opinion on their health problems.

The child is 15 months old. I didn't have any catastrophic problem. But there was ignorance and misunderstanding of what was happening and how to behave in certain situations.

What to do if you offer porridge and only the third type of porridge agrees? And only from a green cup? Will there be problems with speech if we live in a German retirement village and have no contact with children? And many more different questions.

Thanks also to Tatyana Alhamad for the prompt assistance in getting to know your site and the fastest possible selection of a psychologist. Tatyana is a very kind and sympathetic person who is always ready to help everyone, she also shares and provides informational assistance regarding my daughter with school issues. A little about the site, everything is simple, convenient and accessible, a lot of useful and needy help, information for Ukrainians who are alone with their problems in a foreign country. Thank you so much that you did organize such a site, a community that is extremely necessary for everyone who is in a difficult situation!

My son (11 years old) and me were forced to leave our home in Kyiv in March due to hostilities in Ukraine. We lived in Romania (Botosani) for more than two months.

Unfortunately, my diplomas and certificates are not recognized in Romania, and I did not know the local language. It takes years to retrain or learn a language and prove your education.

I needed to have income, in an unfamiliar country, and now that I have returned to Kyiv (and in Ukraine it is not very good with work and security issues now). The GPNow platform allowed me to work remotely while in Romania and now, after returning home. So I can work remotely, and I have the

The most important is that I've got the access to the professional medical advice of a highly-qualified pediatrician during this difficult time, so now I can treat my child in a correct way. I just don't know what I would do, otherwise.

My daughter is only one year old, and she got sick just before the weekend. She had cough and running nose, didn't sleep at night. It's pretty difficult to make a swift appointment with a doctor in Germany, not to mention during the weekend.

So the guys just saved my life. Much appreciation and aratitude!

After our conversations, my eyes seem to open to obvious things. Thank you very much for your work. I am already waiting for our next meeting. Have a nice day!



UCTS PROGRAM – "Anastaysia's Story" CHONDRAL CHORDOMA



A VERY SPECIAL STORY - About a very brave Ukrainian Girl

Anastaysia, from Kyiv now in Poznan Poland is 18 years old living alone in a hostel. A lovely young lady who married her "Romeo" at the start of thr war - a soldier taking care of business back home in Ukraine UA

Anastasia has life-threatening throat and neck cancer and cannot get urgently needed treatment for her condition in Poland as the operation is extremely dangerous and expensive with a 50% probability of success and a high-risk of being rendered quadraplegic.

Alone and afraid reached she heard about our Ukrainian CrisisCare Telehealth
Service and connected with Tanya Alhamad our amazing UCTS Practice Manage
who has taken her under her wing - reaching out to our Chief Medical Officer Dr
Vadim Illyashenko for help.

Thanks to a wonderful lady in the US - April Chepovsky - a registered nurse from California and her "circle-of-friends" we have been able to have Anastaysia's case assessed by one of the top Oncologists at Yale - New Haven clinic and we are now working on a plan to transport Anastaysia to the US to receive the comfort & care she desperately needs...

We have many hurdles to overcome including organising further medical assessments, transport via Germany to the US, travel documents, accommodation and of course the operation itself which will require funding.

We do not know how we will overcome these challenges - but we do know we will NEVER give up on Anastaysia...

Thanks very much for reaching out. Of course, we will do everything in our power to help as we are strong supporters of the Ukrainian people during this awful time. A couple things to consider:

First – based on the video that has been sent – there is an obvious component of a neck mass. That cannot be resected through the nose and will need a resection through the neck, which could be a combined procedure with ENT and Neurosurgery. That said, I need to see all the imaging – MRI, CT scans, anything that you have, to be able to evaluate further the extent of the tumor. Given her symptoms described in the Word document, there must be some spinal involvement and we will need our neurosurgeons involved. I am copying our chief of pediatric neurosurgery as I would appreciate his engagement on this as well

Additionally – I do have a colleague who is the chief of head and neck surgery at a university in Poland, and takes on complex cases like this on a regular basis. If it makes more sense, I am happy to have his involvement if that will expedite care.

IF you can please send us the MRI and CT scans – ideally, the actual images rather than the reports – that would be a good starting point for us.



Please, help! We can't do it alone!



We are a family from Ukraine

Our daughter Polina is 4 years 7 months old and her exact diagnosis has not been established. The child does not speak (there is babble and vocalization), does not understand addressed speech, does not serve herself, toilet skills are lost, there is no eye contact. She uses peripheral vision, does not hold attention for a long time, and is difficult to teach, train. Polina has poorly developed gross and fine motor skills: awkwardness, unsteadiness of gait. She has a delay in intellectual development, but at the same time she is quick-witted. Does not follow elementary instructions, does not imitate. Behavior is disorganized.

A paradoxical behavior resulting from sensory discomfort, she examines objects by licking and sniffing.

The girl was born a healthy baby at term. The first year of her life she developed at the extreme limit of the norm, she was always an active girl. She was vaccinated with all the necessary vaccines according to the schedule. After the first year of life, we (parents) began to notice a deterioration in her well-being and a change in behavior. She began to sleep poorly, the imitation and pointing gesture disappeared. she stopped responding to the name, lost attention and concentration, became whiny and anxious.

We turned to doctors (neurologist, geneticist, pediatrician).

Examination and treatment did not give any results. At 1.6 years old. Polina took nootropics and sedatives. The electroencephalogram at that moment showed the norm. The treatment did not improve her condition at all, on the contrary, the child's sleep and behavior worsened.

Polina began to walk independently at 16 months, her gait was unsteady and clumsy, with a slight trembling of her body.

We did MRI and MRS.

MRS was not normal. In the brain, an increase in the concentration of alanine and phenylalanine. ornithine was found, as well as in the temporal lobes (bilaterally) an increase in the content of glutamic acid. The treatment was started again, from which no improvement was observed.

Polina was found to have HSV1/2, HHV7 and TTV viruses. At the age of 2.6 years Phenylalanine in the blood was increased. The doctors ruled out fetilketonuria as a diagnosis. At the age of 3.6 years, Pompe and Fish genetic syndromes were excluded.

At the age of 3 years 2 months, we submitted the first genetic panel to the US laboratory (INVITAE).

At 3.5 years old, the second genetic panel for 1190 genes was handed over to the same laboratory.

A pathogenic variant was found in the DEAF1 gene in a heterozygote.

Breakage of GRIN1, SPATA5, SZT2 genes with unknown clinical significance.

By this time, classes and restorative therapy did not stop, but they did not give any positive results.

At the age of 4 years 2 months Polina was diagnosed with EPILEPSY in Germany. Then we went to Lvov to do an electroencephalogram of the brain during sleep in order to rule out the Landau-Kleffner diagnosis. The study lasted 80 minutes, the diagnosis was not confirmed, but the diagnosis of epilepsy was not removed. According to EEG monitoring, there are pathological changes in background activity and epileptimorphic activity in the right fronto-central region with spread to the left hemisphere (fronto-central-temporal region) without the presence of prolonged spike-slow activity during sleep.

The child is taking an anticonvulsant and neuroleptics. Still no results.

We lost 3.5 years looking for the right diagnosis. And today we have many examinations, but we do not have a complete diagnosis and proper treatment. Three years of the child, which did not go for the benefit of her development, but only an increasingly strong backlog.

Our family asks for help in the treatment of the child through charitable foundations, to help with sponsorship in order to make the correct diagnosis and choose the right treatment. We want to give Polina the chance to live a fulfilling life. Thank you!



Our doctors are refugees too – we need to establish a sustainable funding model to avoid unnecessary hardship for our dedicated **Ukrainian medical professionals**

Hello, Robert

Yesterday we discussed the issue of payment to doctors, and it became clear that payment would be received in a maximum of 30 days. We would like to inform you that all our doctors and specialists are waiting and continue to work in the same mode, as usual, they understand the situation and do not show dissatisfaction or impatience. But there are a few people who, like everyone else, just continue to do their job, but are now in a challenging life situation and we would like to inform you about this. This is purely our initiative. Perhaps it will be possible to speed up the process a little or start by paying them, or there will be some other alternative way to pay faster:

- 1. Firsenko Elena (gynecologist and the most active doctor on the platform, she consults patients almost around the clock 1488 euros) she is in Spain and does not receive any payments, she has only this source, she decided to move to Germany, where she can receive help, but Today she is in dire need of financial support.
- 2. Nadezhda Zhiva (psychologist 1592 euros) in Italy could not pay the rent and is now forced to look for new housing, while she lost deposits for rent.




